Over the past eight years in shepherding this congregation, more and more I resonate with Paul's personal comments in Colossians 1:28-29, "Christ we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ. For this I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me." This joyful burden of preaching, praying, and pastoring God's flock has required the investment of much time and effort and sacrifice. However, it is an incredible privilege to build you up and help you grow in Christlikeness.

Through this God-given role of leadership, I have developed a deep desire, one that matches the fatherly pastor and writer of 1 John who said, "I have no greater joy than to know that my children walk in the truth" (3 John 4). As I review the previous year of ministry, I'm filled with joy as there is ample evidence that this is indeed what you are doing.

YOU SERVED ONE ANOTHER

Every Sunday, family groups are faithfully organizing, setting up, serving, and cleaning up cookies and coffee so that everyone else is able to enjoy and encourage one another. Needs are shared and prayers are made in these moments that allow us to weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice. Multiple times this past year, "meal trains" were arranged to provide easy meals for families that had returned home from the hospital after a worrisome procedure or joyous birth. You happily drove others to church on a Sunday and some of you drove all the way to Youth Quake with a van full of teens. You lovingly offered your skills to those in need of them, including helping people move, fixing things, and decorating for Christmas. Anytime a request went out you swarmed to the church with the hands and feet of Jesus. Caring for the household of God in these ways and more complete my joy.

YOU WERE BAPTIZED

The Lord had me preach a sermon on the biblical basics of baptism early on in summer. Afterwards, a handful of people responded with a desire to obey Christ's command in this way. By the end of December, we had baptized 16 children, teens, and adults (1 of whom was my daughter). The privilege of guiding sheep that are eager to follow their Shepherd in simple obedience like this completes my joy.

YOU CARED FOR THE NEEDY

When the opportunity arose, you filled our benevolent pantry with food so that we were able to minister to those who walked through our doors hungry for physical and spiritual food. You also abundantly provided so many gifts for families in need at Christmas that the lights on the tree they were placed under were eclipsed by the love you gave. As shocking as the annual Praise Offering total was (more than \$83,000!), it only continued the pattern of generosity with which God has gifted this congregation that witnessed to the less fortunate in our community through liberal donations to the Food Bank, Women's Shelter, and Main Springs.

"Thank you, thank you thank you to all the people who bless us each week, the music teams lift us up in praise to God, the technical people who help bring the music, prayers and message to us at church and home, the elders and pastors for their prayers, ministries and time above and beyond, the people who so faithfully serve in the kitchen, weekly and for special, events, those who clean up after us and keep the church in good repair, so many behind the scenes people we do not even realize the time and effort they spend in preparation, to all who contribute to making our church a house of God where people can come and feel His love...thank you and may you be blessed."

YOU PRAYED WITHOUT CEASING

The staple of any effective ministry is the prayer of its people. No worship service is finished until we have offered everyone the opportunity to pray with righteous and ready brothers and sisters at the front of our sanctuary. On the first Sunday of every month, time is invested in praying for our missionaries, both their general mission as well as their specific needs. You began new initiatives in monthly meetings to pray particularly for prodigals known to our church and where widows can find encouragement. One prayer warrior among us posted over 100 prayers on Facebook and invited others to participate in prayer meetings with other communities of believers. Our prayer team, made up of specific members and your church leadership, has been thrilled and blessed to pray over the hundreds of requests we've received through our prayer cards, website, and email. The fact that the figurative command to pray without ceasing is almost taken literally in this church completes my joy.

YOU SHOWED HOSPITALITY

One of the most Christlike qualities is willingly opening yourself to others. Whether it's a group of you chatting in the foyer with an opening for more people to enter in, or a personal greeting to others before the worship service begins, many of you go out of your way to notice and engage with others. I love greeting the greeters who welcome others with the love of Jesus through their Christ-inspired smiles and handshakes. Ushers have a meaningful ministry as they ensure everyone can participate in worship. You even cheer when it's

It is not easy, nor is it taken lightly, but you have blessed us by willingly trusting God's appointed elders at this time in this place, making our joy complete.

YOU SOUGHT UNITY

Change is a major cause in churches that divide. When the plan to remove the pews was presented, the potential for disunity was felt by all. You turned to prayer with the information and sought the will of the Lord. Looking back at our discussion and decision, I'm not aware of any interactions that would be labelled as hostile and all questions were responded to with respect. This is significant, especially when you compare it with how the world works, and displays the fruit of the Spirit in the life of our church. This, too, completes my joy.

YOU RECEIVED THE WORD OF GOD

As a generally spiritually healthy church, we explored some of the most divisive and uncomfortable topics in 1 Corinthians...and we were blessed by it. Many of you kept telling me how precisely the Lord was speaking to you through His Word and ministering directly to your heart. No matter what the Lord has to say to His Church, you desire to honor Him through obedience because you love Him. Further evidence is in the fact that we now provide our congregation and community with Bible Studies that take place almost every day of the week. This includes Christian Education for all ages before the worship service that helps believers learn the basic biblical believers they should know. Many people have chosen to make this church their own because they have found the food their soul was meant to live on. The Holy Spirit has given you an appetite for the truth and to deepen you knowledge and intimacy with Christ by receiving and submitting to the Bible. This makes my joy complete.

YOU WERE MISSIONARIES

Yes, you really were! How will the lost hear the Gospel if no one will go and tell them? You may not have been one of our young adults who crossed cultures and continents to bear witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. But you were the answer to another important question: How will they go if they are not *sent*? That's where you come in. 3 John 6 instructs us to send missionaries on their way in a manner worthy of God, and when we support them (as we did in our annual budget as well as our Praise Offering), we become fellow workers in their mission! It is no surprise that your evangelistic and mission-mindedness makes my joy complete.

In more ways than I can list and even know, many of you are consistently giving, praying, and serving the Lord behind the scenes, unnoticed by others, but seen and rewarded by your Heavenly Father. Our church is far from perfect, but you are walking in the light, and that fills my heart with joy as I continue to serve you in the year to come.

FOLLOWING THE FIRE

My heart is full as I consider God's call to Strathmore Alliance Church seven years ago. Sara and I are blessed to be a part of this congregation, and I am thankful for her support as she works with me in what God has called me (us) here to do, and this has been another exciting year of serving you together as we serve God. I would like to reminisce for just a bit: When I was called to the position of Associate Pastor, and being interviewed by the Elders, I was presented with a job description. I agreed with it but had some questions about a few aspects of church ministry that were not necessarily spelled out in every detail. So I asked "Is it okay if I blaze my own trail with some of the unknown's of the ministry that lay ahead of me?" They confirmed that it was okay. Well, as I look back, I realize that I haven't been blazing my own trail at all, I've been following the fire!

CHURCH IN-REACH MINISTRY

Connecting with this congregation whether you have attended here for many years or are a newcomer continues to be a great experience. As much as we are excited for those of you who have attended here for a long time, we are excited about our Newcomers as well. Just to give you an idea of the effectiveness of our "Welcome Cards", in 2024 we received 66 Welcome Cards from people who have joined us for worship, to hear messages from the word of God, and to fellowship with other believers. I also respond to each one as well in the preferred way as is checked in the box on the card, and it is a rich experience to get to know them! We also receive many Welcome Cards with prayer requests to which we also respond to if they are signed.

SENIORS MINISTRY

New in 2022 is our ministry to our Seniors called S.A.L.T. (Senior Adults Living Triumphantly). This event, which happens once a month (with a few months off in the summer) is designed to enjoy each other's company around the table over a meal, and to encourage all to continue to grow in God's grace, and to encourage them to "finish well" in faith and in life. Our times together consists of a table quiz, a little reminiscing/storytelling, an inspiration from God's word and a hymn sing to conclude. We are thankful for those who exercise their Spiritual gifts of hospitality and serving in this ministry.

BIBLE STUDIES

2024 Thursday morning Bible Study and Prayer time continues and is well attended. Ted Burger has been faithful in leading us. Men's Wednesday morning 6:30am Bible study continues with Jim Chamberlain and Carmon Wiebe leading. Men's Friday night Bible study takes place in the Fireside room at 7 and is led by Nathan Winters.

CARE/FAMILY GROUPS

Care/Home/Study groups are fewer than the year before, but the ones that are continuing are vibrant and consistent.

FAMILY GROUPS AND COOKIE MINISTRY

Messaging Family Groups continues to be an effective way to communicate church info and various reminders and updates as to what is happening. It is not easy to get Family Groups together; but working together in the Coffee and Cookie Ministry after the church service has been a way to meet and work together for the common good of the Body of Christ, and Family Groups often plan a meal together on their designated Cookie Sunday which only happens about five times in a year. Thank you to all the Family Groups for doing this. It is working well, and what a beautiful way to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ!

CHILD DEDICATIONS

It was likewise a privilege to be involved in child dedication ceremonies for two families as they committed themselves and their little ones to the Lord.

BAPTISMS

It is always great to hear a Christian respond to the voice of the Scriptures and desire baptism. In 2024, I was involved in the baptism of 12 individuals on the confession of their faith in Jesus Christ.

SUNDAY MORNING PRAYER MINISTRY

This ministry continues quietly with faithful people who care for and pray for others.

CHURCH MEMBERSHIPS

It is always encouraging to receive new members into the Body of Christ here at Strathmore Alliance, and I was a privileged to welcome two couples joined the membership in 2024.

MENS MINISTRY

Burgers and Basics For Men continues to be a well-attended event. The first of these events was held on Thursday, Nov. 25 2021 in Gerald Aleman's heated shop just north of Strathmore, and we continue to meet there. One of the exciting things that is happening is that men from this church are bringing guys they work with or their neighbors as well. We continue to BBQ hundreds of pounds of hamburger, and pounds of bacon also in the triple digits, and a lot of cheese! We do more than just eat burgers and visit though; at each event, someone tells their story of how God has led them to be who they are and where they are today. This year our overall theme is to be "Fully Engaged" in following the Lord in and through life, and our verse for that theme is from 2 Chronicles 16:9 which says, For the eyes of the Lord move to and from throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose hearts are completely His. We've had as many as 70 + guys show up, and a few of them that come on a regular basis don't yet know Jesus as their Savior, but they are learning more about Him at every event. It's a beautiful thing! We take a break in the summer months but kick it off again in October or November.

ALLIANCE CHURCH CONNECTION (NEW in 2024)

It is our plan for everyone who makes Strathmore Alliance Church their home church, to be in and participate in a Family Group (and we encourage this), but we have found that this does not work for everyone. These folks are placed in a file called "Alliance Church Connection" (ACC). This is a contact/send file that was developed for those who, for various reasons, cannot be committed to a Family Group but wish to remain connected to Strathmore Alliance Church. These receive all the church info that everyone else receives, and that way we continue to connect with and care for them.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

■ Stampede Parade

Representing Strathmore Alliance, our parade entry was Sara and I in our truck with signs that say, "Jesus loves you and so do we," along with an invitation to join us Sunday mornings.

■ Wheatland Lodge & Sagewood

Our Church service sing-along is approximately every two months. We are thankful when we are joined by some from our congregation.

■ Rodeo Prayer

Pray at the opening of Rodeo events.

■ Pizza Ministry

Offering pizza to our Law Enforcement Agencies (Police Fire Dept, Peace Officers). This happens 2x/yr and the response is encouraging.

COMMUNITY AND CHURCH CELEBRATIONS OF LIFE

We supported people as they grieved and celebrated their loved ones' lives again in 2024:

Strathmore Ministerial

Monthly meetings over the lunch hour once a month. The content of these meetings mostly addresses what is new in the community, and how each church has responded and what we can learn from each other to stay current as we move forward in our community.

Benevolent

People coming by for help include transients and locals who are in need of a tank of gas and/or food from our supply of non-perishables, or gift cards for No-Frills. Some of the stories from these often-mysterious travelers are hard to believe but many are also legitimate, so we do what we believe is right and just in each situation. "Thank you" for keeping our Food Bank at the entrance full. We often pray with those who come to us and share the gospel with them as well; but interestingly enough, almost all of them "know" Jesus as their savior. Once again we had people that tried to make our parking lot a permanent parking spot for their RV.

Along with all of the above, I have been blessed with opportunities to preach on the Sermon of the Mount on Sunday mornings, to preach on Father's Day, leading a study session at a table during Christian Ed., leading Sunday morning music, or leading a Bible Study on occasion for Ted on Thursday mornings.

In conclusion, I count it a blessing to be able to connect with you in either your home or ours, or in a restaurant, and we have much more visiting to do. It has been and continues to be a blessing to serve alongside Pastor Mike, Pastor Ian, the Elders, Alice, and others as together we serve God in the work of His Kingdom. Thank you for the privilege!

Student Ministries Pastor

This year has brought many highs and lows. I'm thankful to God for the work that he started and continued to do in and through our ministry throughout the year. This year's Wednesday Night Live (WNL) youth ministry started off on a high for me as we studied one of my favourite passages. In John chapter 1, we see that Jesus is the Word of God and He has existed with God the Father from the beginning. Seeing our students understand that he's not just a man, but that he's also God was significant to our ministry, and to me personally.

Through the month of February, we continued our All About Jesus series where we learned that all throughout scripture, Jesus is the focus. Each book of the bible (whether overtly or discreetly) points to the culmination of scripture in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. In addition to our regular WNL, Madison and I have been hosting the Sr. High students at our house for the Holy Roast Revival (HRR). This event is one that focuses on our students being able to ask deeper questions about their faith in a safe atmosphere for questions and deep thinking.

By the end of March, we had finished our study in HRR titled Scarred for Good. In this, we saw that through the scars that we have received in our lives (be that physical, mental, emotional, or spiritual), we can use those to point to Jesus and the work that He did on the cross. Our students were invited to share their testimonies in a safe environment and learn how to share those stories of their lives with others and use them as a tool to present the Gospel in a relatable and personal manner.

At this point, we've continued to have a consistent attendance of about 45 students at WNL. We're glad to see both students whose families attend the church, as well as students who are just members of our local community here in Strathmore. In addition to WNL and HRR, we've had the opportunity for fun outreach events to students who are in our community and may not yet be interested in attending a church or youth group. Events like LATE-NIGHT

where we are here at the church from 6pm-12am for games, pizza, karaoke, movies, and much more. There isn't an explicit Gospel presentation at nights like these, but it gives an opportunity for students to be introduced to our volunteer leaders and other students.

The months of April and May brought more amazing ministry opportunities for myself and the rest of our team. We did a handful of events at Trinity Christian Academy and shared the space with the students from Hope Covenant Community Church. Another big event for us was attending Youth Quake at Briercrest College and Seminary. We were able to attend both the Jr. and Sr. High retreats with our students. Though the logistics of organizing transportation, sorting out registrations, communicating with students and parents, and the event itself with all sorts of activities and very little sleep can be daunting, I'm grateful for the chance for our students to continue to hear God's word being preached.

As our regular scheduled youth events began to wind down in June, so did the 2023-24 school year. We were blessed to be able to send off and commission 15 graduates to the next thing that God has planned for them. For some it's overseas missions, others school in all parts of the country, and others are working from home and beginning to attend our Young Adults ministry.

July and August again brought the usual change of pace to youth ministry. School is out of session, and so our calendar doesn't look like it does from September to June. Rather

than the weekly meetings of WNL and HRR, we had Bagels and Bibles. The name tells all! We ate bagels, and studied the Bible together. This summer's study was in the book of Philippians.

Outside of these events, I was grateful to be able to attend the General Assembly of the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Toronto this July with Pastor Mike and Pastor John. I'm also thankful to God for being able to officiate the wedding of a young couple, one of whom has grown up at Strathmore Alliance.

The month of September brought the usual back to school, and back to regularly scheduled ministry chaos. Our first event of the school year was one where not only students attended, but their parents as well. They were able to see what a regular youth night looks like, and understand more about what we do. Following our fall kickoff, we began a new series at WNL titled Life in Community. We as the church, the body of Christ do life together whether we like it or not. The same is true for our youth ministry. This series taught various aspects of

community life, including the transformative impact of community, the significance of deep friendships, navigating conflict within a community, and the power of unity within the church.

September also brought with it an increased emphasis from myself and Madison on our young adults group. With that came a new name for the ministry: What's Next Young Adults Ministry. The idea here is that from the ages of 18-30, people are often asked the question:

I want to take a moment here to thank all of our volunteers who are involved in the various ministries with people ages 13-30 in our church. That's a huge age range that I work with, and I certainly wouldn't be able to shepherd them on my own. Thank you so much to all of you.

"What's Next?" Be that for work, school, in their faith, or anywhere in between. We want our students to be able to have Jesus not just as a part of their lives that they slot in around school, work, social lives, and everything else, but rather for him to be the one that is the focus of each of those avenues of their lives.

October and November were solid months for both our youth group and young adults ministry. December and the advent season came along so fast! It felt like January was just yesterday. This year ended off with a bang! We had our WNL Christmas banquet and HRR Christmas party both in the month of December. I'm so thankful for all of our students in these ministries and the fact that they all continue to teach me things on a regular basis. I look forward to next year and the work that God will continue to do in and through this ministry at Strathmore Alliance Church.

2024 was a very busy year for our Children's Ministry team. We continue to serve our children and families in an increasingly hectic world. We, at

Strathmore Alliance Church, have been blessed with a dedicated, loving group of volunteers.

I am so thankful for the people who take the time out of their busy lives to teach, build relationships with and serve our youngest family members.

We currently have 27 adults and 15 young people volunteering on a regular basis. We have had 86 kids take part in our program this year; 13 regular kids in Nursery, 19 kids have attended Christian Education and 59 kids have attended Bright Lights. Our attendance for Christian Education has decreased from last year but the attendance for Bright Lights has increased significantly. Although our number of adult volunteers have increased, we have fewer people willing to teach classes.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

This year in Christian Education, because of reduced numbers of kids, have combined all age groups. We have begun a new curriculum from the publishers of the Biggest Story Bible. It leads our kids through the Bible from the very beginning of creation to the return of Jesus. Its goal is to help kids grasp the Bible's overarching message of redemption. The kids seem to be engaged with this new program and continue to learn weekly memory verses as well as learn about God's continuing work in us.

BRIGHT LIGHTS

Bright Lights was so effective last year that we decided to once again expand our program and include grade six. Our goal continues to be to support our children in critically reading the Bible for themselves. Each week, we take the scripture being preached on and teach the kids how to understand it more deeply. Our ultimate goal being that the kids will be able to study their Bible independently. As their confidence in reading and more importantly, their understanding of scripture increases, it is our prayer that our kids will learn to love our Lord more.

DAY CAMP

We hosted a one day camp over the Easter Break in 2024. Nineteen kids took over our church and had tons of fun decoding messages, participating in games, singing and learning about how to be in God's Secret Service. Our team is currently planning to host a similar event this April.

We took a break over the summer as we did not have enough volunteers to run a Summer Day Camp at the church again in 2024. If there is any interest in helping to plan/run Summer Day Camp this year or if you have any questions regarding any of our kids programming please contact Crystal Cavanagh or Pat Coone.

SERVE YOUR CHURCH

Although we have been blessed with a strong team of volunteers, as we expand our Bright Lights program, our need for adults willing to teach also has increased. 

Finance Committee REPORT

January 30, 2025

To the Pastors, Elders and membership of the Strathmore Alliance Church,

I have reviewed the financial statements and policies for the fiscal year ending December 2024 and found the records and accounting policies to be appropriate and in good order.

The review took place on January 29,2025 at the Strathmore Alliance Church with Alice Le Cerf. I completed a review of the financial statements, property assessments, insurance records, banking records, expense records and donation receipts. A listing of the findings can be reviewed below:

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

- A two-year comparative balance sheet was reviewed to identify any significant or unexplained changes between years.
- The income statement was examined for any unusual transactions. Alice confirmed that there
 were none during the year. A review of the capital purchases identified a recommendation
 that the renovation costs be added to the buildings value and not the furniture and fixtures.
 As there is no tax basis this is not essential, but it does better represent the value of the
 investment. A fair value adjustment of the cash on hand is recommended for year end in
 2025.
- Monthly financial reports continue to be reviewed by the finance committee and presented at regular Elders' meetings for acceptance. Any errors follow a review process with the treasurer, and if necessary, are escalated to the Elders. The treasurer remains available for these reviews.
- The additional casual employee, Justina, was confirmed to be a member of the church and approved by the board. The added role is very beneficial to the church by improving job responsibility coverage.
- Financial records from the past seven years continue to be securely scanned and stored.
 Records that require indefinite retention are also securely maintained.
- All financial data is secured with password protection, and digital files are automatically backed up daily. However, the backup system requires maintenance.

- The 2023 T3010B filing was successfully completed, and the 2024 records are set to be filed soon. The Registered Charity Status remains in good standing.
- The receipts for 2024 donor receipts match the SAGE software records. A sample receipt was reviewed and confirmed it continues to comply with CRA regulations.

DONATIONS / DEPOSITS

- SAC continues to properly record contributions, ensuring compliance with regulations regarding restricted and unrestricted funds. An external Excel tally is also maintained to track spending as per donor requests.
- Electronic contributions continue to be processed smoothly.

EXPENSES / PAYABLES

- Expense approvals remain effective, ensuring transactions are properly authorized by an additional signatory.
- Payroll policies have been reviewed and are in good standing.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- The Benevolence policy remains unchanged, continuing to include cumulative tracking and approval levels. The procedures remain aligned with Canadian Council of Christian Charities guidelines.
- Online access to the CRA account would be beneficial and Alice is continuing to pursue this
 access. The CRA is continuing to push towards online-only communication for businesses
 and charities, it is recommended that Alice be designated as a CRA representative. Alice has
 a plan to coordinate with the current representative to help the transition occur in 2025.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

• The finance committee currently consists of five members who review reports and escalate significant matters to the Elders board.

I can review the books next year, but it would be beneficial to have a fresh perspective. If someone else is available, please consider asking them.
